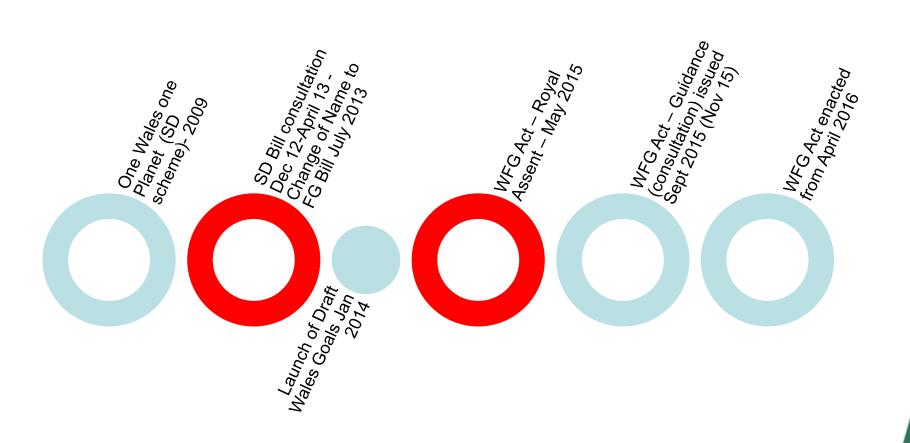

What have we learned so far?

- Need awareness, leadership and systemic change
- WFG thinking can be used to shape transformational change
- Governance, strategic and service planning, risk assessment, scrutiny, audit all need to be reviewed
- Risk, however, that some will see it as a compliance issue
- The thinking needs to be 'upstream to shape' not 'downstream to justify'
- Major awareness raising/training exercise needed which then follows through into performance appraisal
- Need simultaneous approach with PSB/other partners



What have we learned so far?

- Tools/exercises can help LAs/other public bodies to prepare
 - self assessment,
 - long term planning,
 - ward level fore-sighting,
 - 7 core areas checklist,
 - Member role change,
 - community engagement,
 - Officer briefing

The spectrum of response

Spectrum of response to the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015

Head in Sand	We are doing all this anyway so nothing changes. Short term takes precedence
Compliance	We'll tweak what we are doing to meet the reporting and statutory requirements
Implicit	Future Generation's needs are implicit in our work, so a slight change in emphasis and words
Stretched Horizon	We need to think much longer term—decadal planning—despite uncertainties
Adapt	We need to critically re-examine our existing approach and change it accordingly
Transform	We use the Act to appraise and transform our whole approach over time
