- Two years' work has taken place, both in Scotland and Wales
- Wales pilot communities from 2017 to 2019: Leeswood/Pontblyddyn (Flintshire)
 Milford Haven (Pembrokeshire)
- From 2019:

Holywell (Flintshire)

Dale peninsula (Pembrokeshire)

What has been achieved so far?

Leeswood/Pontblyddyn



- Maximising use of the fantastic village hall, including re-modelling of part of the hall to create space for a new weekly community café
- Work with the local school to grow food and to involve the children in the naming of the new community cafe
- Afternoon teas and carvery events to bring people together over great food
- A regular Film Club
- Litter picks to encourage community pride.

What has been achieved so far?



- An events listing for the town to enable residents to find low-cost/no-cost community activities....now taken on by Youth Matters
- A local email group (100 members) to share news and events....now taken on by Youth Matters
- Help given to community members to revive a muchmissed lunch club
- Various weekly social groups established.....handicraft and board-games
- Worked with community members to provide mental health sessions and weekly lunches in an area of town where there is hardship
- Worked with community disability campaigner and Port Authority to place seating at local supermarket.

Community engagement

- Informal volunteering
- Encourages the building of relationships between community members
- Encourages people to feel hopeful about what they can do in their communities and what their communities can do for them
- Realizes the small dreams.
