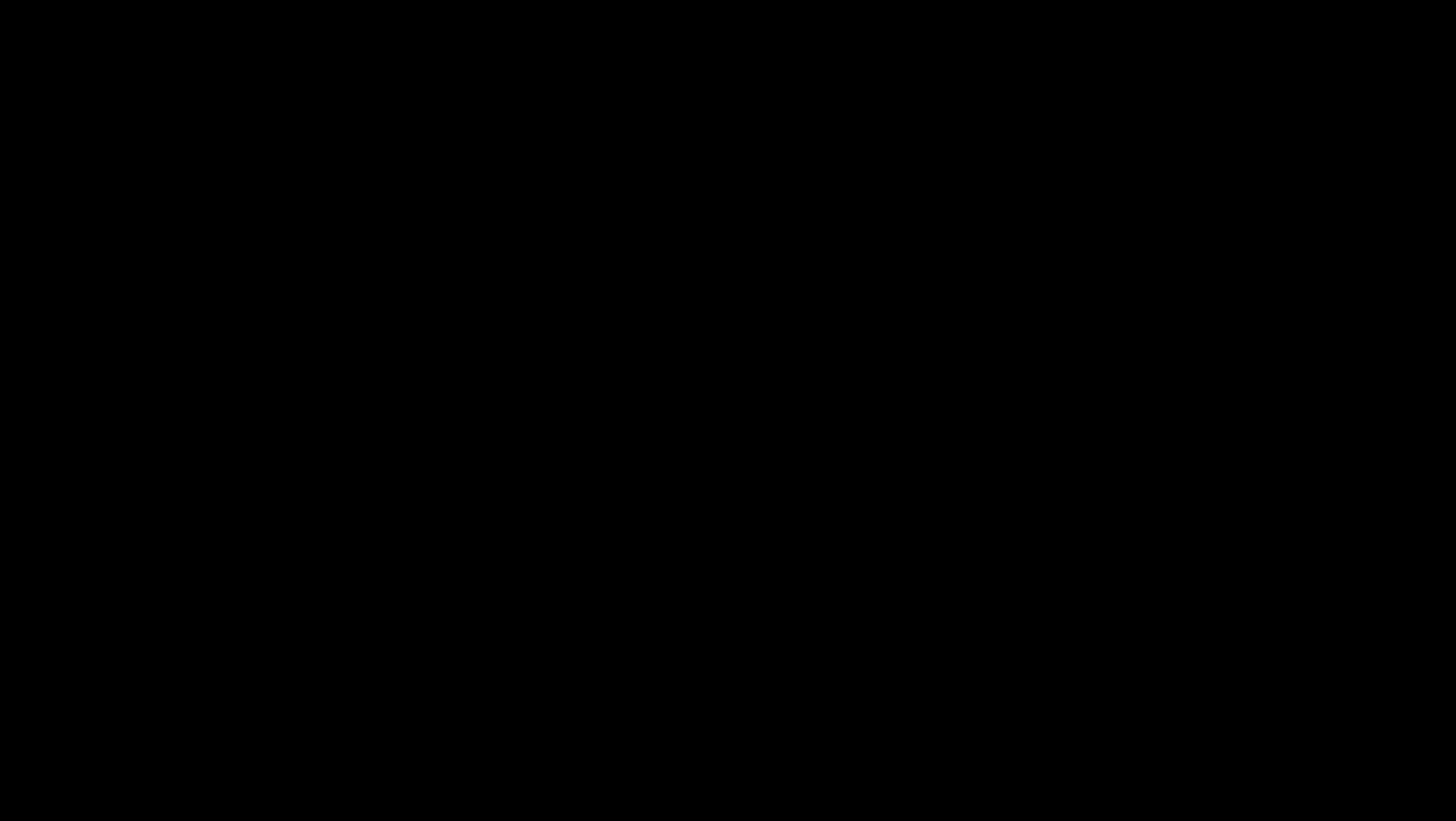

During these sessions, the ministers will explore what kind of administrative structures, models and management systems provide good tools for problem solving across sectors.

Learning about the ideas New Yorkers have for making their city government work better

Following the 2013 mayoral election in New York City, Talking Transition brought thousands of New Yorkers together to join open conversations about the most pressing public policy issues, ideas, and questions that affect communities across the city. Over the course of more than two weeks, they created a forum for these discussions by hosting live events in a pop-up “tent” by bringing the conversations to neighbourhoods across all five boroughs.
